Pearl Harbour and City Tour : Take a special look at Honolulu's history on the Pearl Harbor & Honolulu City Tour. Travel first to Historic Pearl Harbor, site of the Arizona Memorial Museum, where time is allowed for you to explore the museum, view the movie and take a launch out to the Arizona Memorial. After this very moving experience, it's off on a fully narrated tour of the highlights of the city. You'll visit Punchbowl Crater, home of the National Cemetery of the Pacific and into the downtown area for a look at the State Capital and Washington Place, former home to Hawaiian Royalty and Hawaii's Governors. A stop at the state landmark, the King Kamehameha Statue, will be made, allowing for photo opportunities. View the only royal palace on American soil - Iolani Palace; Kawaiahao Church - where services are still held in the native Hawaiian language; and the Mission Houses. A drive through the colorful Chinatown district completes this informative day!

Polynesian Cultural Centre : At the 42-acre Polynesian Cultural Center, immerse yourself in the customs of the real Polynesia as natives demonstrate the arts of dancing with fire, making jewelry from plants, climbing 50-foot trees in bare feet and more with the new 'Go Native!' activities. You can also take a leisurely canoe ride through the Center, learn Tongan spear throwing, do the Haka war dance of New Zealand, swim with hundreds of sharks in an awe-inspiring IMAX movie, visit ancient carvings at the Easter Island exhibit, and visit our newest exhibit, The Losepa Voyaging Canoe at the Hawaiian Village.

Big Island Tour : The Island of Hawaii, commonly known as The Big Island, is a land rich in ancient Hawaiian history and culture. There is enormous diversity in the landscape, ranging from vast barren lava fields to sprawling cattle ranches, from rugged shoreline to massive 14,000 ft. mountain peaks, and from active volcanoes spewing lava, to lush, dense tropical rainforests.

The Big Island is the home of world renowned Kona coffee and the main provider of macadamian nuts. The opportunity to experience the awesome spectacle of volcanoes, either on a [land tour](#) or by [helicopter](#) should not be missed. For [deep sea fishing](#) enthusiasts, the Kona Coast is one of the world's best locations. You may also choose to enjoy the rare chance to [swim with dolphins](#) in the wild!

D6 HONOLULU

One day Maui : The West Maui Island tour is rich with history and beauty. You'll see many of Maui's most popular sights, including Iao Valley, Kahakuloa, Lahaina Town, and lush Maui Tropical Plantation.

Iao Valley is a tranquil paradise of exotic plants and natural pools. Towering emerald peaks guard the lush valley floor. Rising 2,250 feet out of the earth you'll see a rock pinnacle, known as "Iao Needle." This green stone pillar was used as a natural altar in ancient times. The top of the Iao Needle is sometimes hidden behind mist or clouds, but that often only adds to the drama of this extraordinary natural wonder. The valley is full of tropical flowers, rainbows, waterfalls and swimming holes. There is a well-marked path from the parking lot to view Iao Needle and the ridge-top lookout provides incredible views of the valley. Upon leaving the Iao Valley you will head to Kahakuloa, a place untouched by time. The small pastoral village by the sea is accentuated by the 636 ft high landmark shoreline rock head on the point. As you continue on around West Maui, you can visit Whaler's Village at Kaanapali Beach and take a swim at Maui's best beach. Next stop is the quaint and historical Lahaina Town. It harks back to the 1840s when up to four hundred whaling ships would anchor there. Lahaina is now a mecca for shoppers with charming boutique shops, numerous art galleries, and an array of world class restaurants. Check out the 110-year-old giant Banyan tree, the Pioneer Inn Hotel built in 1906, and the wharf's bits of history that have been carefully preserved. Since the 1700s, when King Kamehameha made it his home, Lahaina has been a casual place of merriment, and it still is to this day.

From Lahaina you'll proceed along the picturesque coastline with breathtaking views, and then head across the Central Valley to the Maui Tropical Plantation. This 60 acre working plantation offers a tram tour through the fields of 15 native fruits and plants including papaya, guava, mango, macadamia nuts, coffee, avocado, bananas, sugar cane, star fruit and more. There is also a Country Store stocked with a variety of Maui grown and made products.

This 5 hour tour is an excellent opportunity to experience and learn much about beautiful West Maui
